

CODE OF CONDUCT

Students' behavior is governed by the Canton Central School District Code of Conduct throughout Summer School. Students are expected to conduct themselves in a manner that contributes to a positive educational environment. Students will be subject to appropriate disciplinary action for inappropriate behavior. Such misconduct includes, among others, matters involving possession of weapons; possession or use of illegal drugs, alcohol or tobacco; foul language; disrespectful behavior; and violent, reckless, or disruptive behavior. Disciplinary action may include suspension from school. Serious misconduct may result in dismissal from Summer School. Students must either be in a supervised class or in the Learning Resource Center (LRC). Loitering is not permitted in the halls or on school grounds. Food and beverages are not permitted in classrooms or the LRC.

STUDENT APPEARANCE

Students are expected to dress appropriately for school and to attend to personal cleanliness. Clothing that disrupts or interferes with the educational process is not acceptable. Footwear must be worn at all times. Hats and other headgear are not permitted in instructional areas.

REGISTRATION

Students may pre-register for Summer School at their home district Guidance Office through Friday, June 27, 2008. On-site registration at the Canton High School Office will be held on Monday 6/30 and Tuesday 7/1 from 8:00-1:00. Late registration on a space available basis will

occur on Monday, July 7th from 1:00-3:00 pm at Canton High School. Students must have written authorization from their districts to register on the June 30, July 1 and July 7 dates.

Registration Notes

- ❑ Students repeating a course must have achieved a course grade of at least 50 during the school year to be eligible to attend Summer School.
- ❑ Students who are to take Living Environment must have successfully completed course laboratories during the school year to be eligible to register for this course.
- ❑ Students who do not pre-register at their home district must register in person or be registered by a parent/guardian at Canton. A copy of the school report card must be presented at the time of registration.
- ❑ Students with Individualized Education Plans (IEPs) or 504 Accommodation Plans must provide a copy at registration.
- ❑ Tuition for students from nonparticipating districts is \$60/course. Checks should be made payable to Canton Central School.

IMPORTANT NOTES

Transportation will not be provided for Canton students; others may contact their own district. The Summer School does not provide transportation, food services, lockers, or a regular school nurse. Medical assistance required by students will result in a phone call to a parent/guardian or to 911 if an emergency arises.

REGENTS EXAMINATIONS

Students wishing to take a Regents Exam on a “walk-in” basis must register to do so by Monday, July 14, 2008. Students must have permission from their home district when registering. There is a \$25.00 grading fee for all walk-in students who are not attending Summer School. (Checks in the amount of \$25.00 should be made

payable to the “Canton Central School District.”)

ATTENDANCE

Successful academic performance is directly linked to student presence and active participation in class. Attendance will be taken daily in every class.

COURSE CREDIT AND GRADING

To receive credit for a course taken during Summer School, students must achieve both a passing average and have earned at least 20 participation points for that course. A zero will be assigned for any student accumulating less than 20 participation points. Class participation is a daily assessment of the quality of the student’s participation as judged by the teacher based upon the following criteria:

Participation Rubric

Students earn one (1) point when they:

- ❑ are prepared to participate
- ❑ successfully complete assigned readings and written work
- ❑ are cooperative, attentive, and responsive during class

- ❑ contribute to class activities
- Students earn no (0) points when they:
- ❑ are unprepared, unwilling, or unable to work
 - ❑ do not complete assignments in a timely or satisfactory manner
 - ❑ are disruptive, inattentive, or unresponsive during class
 - ❑ absent

The overall grading scheme is as follows:

A final examination will be given in all courses. A student who does not take the appropriate final will earn a zero on that examination. Progress reports will be issued to students halfway through Summer School. Final grade reports will be sent to home district Guidance Offices for distribution.
